Our Mission Statement

The mission of Bishop Kearney High School is to empower young men and women to reach their full potential —spiritually, academically, and socially—

by providing a college preparatory, values based Catholic education in a safe, student-centered family atmosphere, in keeping with the tradition of the Christian Brothers and the School Sisters of Notre Dame.

Our Core Classes:

Theology: Theology is required for all four years. Our program is designed to assist students in facing the challenges of young adulthood by growing in their understanding of God and themselves as they explore the values, belief and traditions of the Catholic Christian Community, as set forth by the *Magisterium and The Catechism of The Catholic Church*.

English: English is required for all four years. The primary function of the English department is to provide the students with the necessary skills to achieve each of the following objectives in English studies: an understanding of and appreciation of literature; improving writing proficiency; developing vocabulary; and the ability to communicate successfully and clearly in both oral and written forms.

Social Studies: Social Studies is required for four years. It is the department's goal to instill a pool of knowledge and skills while engendering an appreciation for History and the other Social Sciences as resources and tools for understanding the present through the past, in hope of a future closer to the Christian ideals of justice and peace.

Mathematics: Math is required for three years. All Mathematics courses are designed to provide students with ample opportunities to acquire problem-solving and critical thinking skills necessary for successful functioning in an information based society. Though there is a wide range of courses designed for students of varied skill levels, all are college preparatory and are designed to ready students for a two year or four year college classroom.

Science: Science is required for three years. The department offers a wide array of challenging and exciting courses for every student. Hands-on laboratory work is an integral part of every course, recognizing that the key to learning is student involvement.

Languages Other Than English: LOTE is required for two years. The primary function of the department is to enable students to have a working knowledge of the language and culture through the development of listening, reading, writing and speaking skills.

The School and Community

Bishop Kearney High School is a private, Catholic, college preparatory high school administered by a lay board of trustees and sponsored by the Congregation of Christian Brothers. Located in Irondequoit, a northeast suburb adjacent to the city of Rochester, Bishop Kearney serves approximately 400 students, grades 7-12 from the City of Rochester and the majority of surrounding suburbs in Monroe and Wayne counties. The school serves students of all ethnic, cultural, and economic backgrounds. Admission decisions are based on an entrance exam, a review of academic records, recommendations, and student interview.

Graduation Requirements

All students at Bishop Kearney are required to earn a minimum number of credits in each of the subject areas.

Grading System

GPA: Is based on a weighted grading system with all courses included. All grades are based on a 100 point numerical scale. Advanced placement courses are granted a weight of 1.05 credits.

Class Rank: Is determined at the end of three years and updated in January of the senior year. Class rank is based upon the cumulative weighted average for all subjects. In order to be eligible to be ranked, a student must have been enrolled at Bishop Kearney for two out of the three previous years. If a student has enrolled at Bishop Kearney fewer than two years, and approximate rank will be used.
